Advocate Positions:

1. I support a mayor elected-at-large.

• Voters in Richmond have previously supported an elected-at-large mayor. I support the Wilder-Bliley plan, with the exception that I support maintaining the nine district seats and *not creating* two elected-at-large council seats.

I support a reduction of the work day by two (2) hours.

- · A reduction of the work day is long overdue.
- · Less hours mean happier, healthier workers.
- The City can lead by example, by not cutting pay or benefits. This is the kind of progressive legislation, we--as voters, should demand of government.

3. I support the legalization of marijuana.

• Globally and nationally, marijuana is becoming a viable commodity, like tobacco. Richmond's unique history make it the natural leader for such a movement. Marijuana taxes should initially be used to develop city rail infrastructures in Norfolk, Richmond, and Northern Virginia. After that it should be primarily used for education and healthcare. I also support the release of non-violent drug offenders, and the implimentation of job training and addiction treatment programs.
